Also, our Halloween parade, trick or treat night, Christmas tree lighting, and the Macungie Holiday event that features a scavenger hunt and Christmas parade provide a great time for everyone to come out and enjoy our community events.

It is an honor to serve as your mayor. As the mayor of the borough, my main responsibility is to oversee the police department. Our dedicated Officers along with myself will continue to work toward building trust, reducing crime, creating a safe environment, and enhancing the quality of life in our community. Please follow the department's website and Facebook page for special community events with our Police Officers. A local community Police Department can offer services that the State Police cannot, such as automatically responding to medical emergencies and fire calls and being at community events. Our Officers have saved lives because they can respond quickly to calls. I want to thank the community for all of the support that you have given the Police Department over the years.

We are also very lucky to have our own local volunteer fire department right here in town. Our fire department is located within 1 mile of most of our residents. Some people in the Lehigh Valley are served by departments that are 2 to 3 or more miles away from where they live. I watched a video of one of our Firefighters walking on the roof of a burning building to cut open holes to allow smoke and heat out of the building. I was also on the scene at an apartment building fire in the Borough and watched our Firefighters and Police rescue residents from the building and take them to the fire station to give them shelter and give them food and drinks until they had a place to go. They do not just fight fires they also help out at community events like directing traffic and helping people cross the streets at the car shows, on trick-or-treat night and at our Christmas tree lighting ceremony. They are a big part of our Halloween and Christmas parades. These brave men and women leave family gatherings and their warm beds on the coldest of winter nights and are willing to risk their lives and endure intense training in order to volunteer for us to feel protected. Whenever you see a First Responder, Police, Fire, or EMS say thank you for all that they do for us.

Remember Government works best when the community gets involved. So, attend meetings, write letters, and send e-mails. I look forward to seeing you around town. I wish you all good health and happiness!





#### **PROPERTY TAX/RENT REBATE PROGRAM EXPANDED**

Act 7 of 2023 increases income limits for the Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program for homeowners and renters to \$45,000 annually. The law also raises the maximum rebate each homeowner or renter can receive from \$650 to \$1,000.

Thanks to the new law, more than 150,000 additional Pennsylvania residents will be eligible for assistance, which is more important than ever due to rising costs driven by inflation. The expansion will be in effect in 2024 when residents apply for assistance based on rent and property taxes paid in 2023.

There is still time to apply for the 2023 rebate, which is based on rent and property taxes paid in 2022. Apply online at www.mypath.pa.gov or contact my Lower Macungie Township office for free assistance. Our phone numbers are 610-965-9933 or 1-833-933-3675 (toll-free). The deadline to apply for a rebate is Dec. 31, 2023.

The easiest way to check the status of a payment is to use the "Where's My Rebate? Tool" on the Department of Revenue's website at www. revenue.pa.gov. A Social Security number, claim year and date of birth are required to do so.

The Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program benefits eligible residents 65 years and older; widows and widowers 50 years and older; and people with disabilities 18 years and older.

While I am pleased we are helping more taxpayers through this program, there are still too many who are struggling to make ends meet. The Commonwealth needs to do even more to reduce or eliminate school property taxes.

#### FALL 2023 LEAF COLLECTION SCHEDULE

The Borough has contracted for fall leaf collection in 2023. There will be no charge for the collection procedure. Leaves will be collected curbside during the following weeks:

> November 13th November 20th November 27th December 4th

- Leaves must be at the curb before 7:00 a.m. and will be picked up when the contractor passes through. The contractor will not make special trips to pick up leaves placed at the curb after they have picked up leaves in the area.
- Leaves must be raked to the edge of the road into long narrow rows not more than 18 inches into the road.



- **Note:** For your safety and that of the public, leaf piles placed in the road beyond 18 inches from the edge of the road are a hazard to the motoring public, school buses, and emergency vehicles.
- Leaves not placed as described or leaves left around parked cars will not be removed. Do not mix tarps, dog waste, branches, twigs, rocks, shrubbery, grass clippings, or plastic bags in with leaves.
- Also, you can use your 2023 Yard Waste Pass to take leaves to the Emmaus Yard Waste Site.

#### PRACTICAL GUIDE TO SNOW PREPAREDNESS

The Public Works Department is dedicated to the safety of all of our residents. The process of snow removal, which varies due to the intensity of each snow event, is a challenge for all of us. In an effort to prepare our residents for impending snowstorms, we offer this guide to keep you informed as to what to expect when it snows.

#### SAFETY FIRST!

If a weather emergency is declared it is mandatory that all vehicles be moved from the streets. This allows access to snow plowing equipment so that these roads can remain open to emergency vehicles. Any vehicles in violation of the weather emergency requirements may be subject to towing and the cost of reclamation.

#### **SNOW EMERGENCY ROUTES:**

- Cedar Street (north side) from Church St. to Spring St.
- Church St. (east side), from Main St. to the South Borough Line.
- Lea St. (east side), from Main St. to Cotton St.
- Locust St. (north side), from Church St. to the West Borough Line.
- Main St. (north and south side) from the Borough line to Borough Line
- Poplar St. (west side) from Main St. to Hickory St.

#### **DESIGNATED PARKING AREAS:**

During a declared snow and ice emergency only, parking will be provided for residents at the following locations:

- Borough Hall Parking Lot
- Macungie Institute Parking Lot
- Flower Park Parking Lot

Plowing occurs as needed when weather conditions arise. Our priority is to keep emergency routes and roads open to allow for emergency vehicles and school buses. We attempt to maintain at least one lane of traffic on these roads. Residential streets, secondary roads, and cul-de-sacs are plowed after emergency routes are open.

If possible, we plow from curb to curb. This may take several return trips to your neighborhood depending upon the severity of the snow and because of obstructions on your street. If cars are parked on your street, we will remove as much snow as possible.


**Note:** Our plow trucks do not travel at speeds of more than 20 mph faster speeds create a throwback effect on the windshield. The force of snow being thrown from a plow creates the illusion that the vehicle is moving at a fast rate of speed. As we clean your street; we have no place to push the snow except to the cub line. Be aware that if you clean your driveway, sidewalk, or mailbox before we are finished with your street, it will be plowed back in. This is unavoidable, so please save yourself the aggravation and wait until we have made our final pass.

**SNOW REMOVAL TIP..** if your driveway is cleared before the street is completed, clear an area to the left of the driveway entrance (standing in the driveway, facing the street). When your street is plowed, the snow from the plow can be unloaded in this area instead of your driveway. The more snow you can clear from this area, the less will be deposited at your driveway entrance.

DO NOT SHOVEL OR SNOW BLOW SNOW INTO THE ROADWAYS...

this practice is illegal under the State Motor Vehicle Code and Borough of Macungie CODE OF ORDINANCE CHAPTER 296 ARTICLE IV. And, it is extremely hazardous. Property owners are also advised that they are responsible for any actions of snow removal services that they hire.

**MOVE YOUR VEHICLES...**to off-street parking whenever possible. Parked cars are a hindrance and hazard to our snow removal efforts.





REMOVE OTHER OBSTRUCTIONS...such as garbage cans, recycling containers, basketball hoops, and trailers.

**SIDEWALKS...**are the responsibility of the property owner. Our ordinance requires that all sidewalks must be cleared within 24 hours after the snow has ceased to fall or the ice has formed.

**HANDICAPPED RAMPS...**If you have a handicapped ramp on your sidewalk, you are responsible for maintaining that ramp free of ice and snow, so it is accessible by pedestrians. The same rule applies to handicapped ramps that apply to sidewalks.

**PLEASE HAVE PATIENCE...**Snow removal is a tedious and time-consuming job. Our crews work many hours under very difficult conditions to keep you safe. Travel should be limited during a snowfall and immediately after, unless absolutely necessary. REMEMBER... we are all trying to achieve the same goal of keeping our roadways safe and traffic moving. During snow events SAFETY is paramount, convenience is secondary. Hopefully, we can work together to achieve these goals.
